How to use the training matrix

All elements of the training matrix are completely optional. Hep C U Later recommend picking at least one hepatitis C training option and exploring the resources you think may be useful to use within your organisation. Hep C U Later also recommend exploring the websites of the organisations which offer further information and support in case you need to access them for a patient in the future.



Why is it important to understand more about hepatitis C?

There is a global goal of eliminating hepatitis C by 2030, England's aim is to achieve this goal by 2025. To achieve this goal and maintain elimination it is vital that professionals understand how hepatitis C is transmitted, how it affects the body, how to test, and how to treat the virus.

Purpose of the Hepatitis C Training Matrix:

The Hepatitis C Training Matrix is for use by any professional who wants to complete training to:

- 1. Improve or update their existing knowledge of hepatitis C
- 2. Gather evidence of completing training for CPD
- 3. Generate reflective pieces (eg. for nurse revalidation)

The Hepatitis C Training Matrix comprises of:

- Hepatitis C training (in various formats to promote flexible learning)
- Hepatitis C resources (which can be used if the professional finds them useful within their organisation)
- Key published documents on hepatitis C (eg. Information on prevalence or current guidance)
- Organisations which provide hepatitis C information and/or support
- Case studies and good practice examples
